ABOUT GIANT PRAWN CONFERENCES

GIANT PRAWN Conferences are the premier global events dedicated to the farming of freshwater prawns, *Macrobrachium spp.* The giant prawn conferences were founded by Michael New, and the inaugural conference took place in Bangkok (GIANT PRAWN 1980). Subsequent conferences were held in Kochi, India (2003 and 2011), Bangkok, Thailand (2017 and 2023), and Shanghai, China (2019). Since 2017, the Aquaculture Program of the Asian Institute of Technology (AIT), Thailand, has led the organization of these conferences. Beginning in 2019, AIT has collaborated with Shanghai Ocean University (SHOU), China, to host the conference, and is supported by Michael New as its Patron.

GP 2025 is set to return to China, promising to showcase significant advancements in farming and conservation of freshwater prawns in the *Macrobrachium* genus. The event will highlight China's pivotal role in producing a substantial share of improved prawn broodstock. Although the conference title may suggest a focus on the Giant Malaysian prawn (*M. rosenbergii*), the event encompasses all *Macrobrachium* species currently under cultivation.

GIANT PRAWN 2025 is organized by AIT, Thailand, jointly with the Shanghai Ocean University, led by Krishna R Salin at the Aquaculture and Aquatic Resources Management (AARM) Program of AIT, Thailand, and Xuxiong Huang of SHOU, China. The event is co-organized with the Zhejiang Institute of Freshwater Fisheries (ZIFF), China, and Huzhou University (HU), China. The venue this year is the historic city of Huzhou in Zhejiang Province of China.

HISTORY OF GIANT PRAWN CONFERENCE

The first GIANT PRAWN Conference was organized by **Michael New** in **1980** for the Thai Department of Fisheries and took place in the original Erawan Hotel in Bangkok. At that time, Michael was working for the FAO as a co-manager of a UNDP-supported project aimed at expanding the farming of freshwater prawns as an emerging aquaculture industry. It focused on several areas of prawn farming, including:

- A platform for global freshwater prawn farming
- Modern Prawn research
- Discussions & Seminars
- Innovative food processing techniques
- Awareness to aquafarmers
- Summarizing and planning section

GIANT PRAWN 1980 brought together researchers, practitioners, and stakeholders involved in freshwater prawn farming for the first time. The conference set priorities for future research and development in the field. A comprehensive proceedings volume summarizing the latest research on *Macrobrachium* at the time was published by Elsevier.

In **2003**, another landmark conference, Freshwater Prawn 2003, was organized by **C. Mohanakumaran Nair** at the College of Fisheries, Kerala Agricultural University, in Kochi, Kerala, India. Michael New delivered the keynote address at this conference, which was attended by nearly 500 delegates from around the world. The event provided a significant boost to freshwater prawn farming in India. Selected papers were published as a special edition of the international journal *Aquaculture Research* (Wiley), while the full proceedings were published by Allied Publishers in New Delhi, India.

In **2011**, Michael New collaborated with C. Mohanakumaran Nair at Kerala Agricultural University and the World Aquaculture Society to organize GIANT PRAWN 2011, the second conference in the series, held again in Kochi. This event coincided with the Asian Pacific Aquaculture 2011, the annual conference of the World Aquaculture Society – Asian Pacific Chapter. Selected papers from the conference were also featured in a special issue of the journal *Aquaculture Research* (Wiley).

In **2017**, Michael New partnered with **Krishna R. Salin** to organize another Giant Freshwater Prawn Conference at the Asian Institute of Technology (AIT) in Bangkok, collaborating with the Department of Fisheries, Thailand. The conference attracted 150 delegates from 35 countries and highlighted the status of *Macrobrachium* aquaculture across several nations.

The GIANT PRAWN **2019** Conference, the fifth in the series, was held at Shanghai Ocean University's Lingang Campus in the Pudong District of Shanghai, China, collaborating with **Xuxiong Huang** at SHOU. This conference provided a valuable platform for the global freshwater prawn farming community to review recent research findings and set priorities for future development.

In **2023**, the 6th edition of this Conference (GIANT PRAWN 2023) was jointly organized by the Asian Institute of Technology (AIT), Shanghai Ocean University (SHOU), and the Department of Fisheries, Thailand, in Bangkok, Thailand. Themed *Another Giant Leap for Sustainability*, the conference brought together 180 participants from 17 countries, further advancing global discussions on sustainable freshwater prawn farming.

Huzhou's research breakthroughs include all-male breeding technology and white-tail disease diagnostics, earning prestigious awards and supporting a thriving "Shrimp + Technology + Brand" industry. Supplying 27 provinces and generating an annual output of over 7 billion Yuan (USD 1 billion), Huzhou is a global leader in freshwater prawn research and production.

CHINESE VISA REQUIREMENTS

Logistics and Visa Requirements for GIANT PRAWN 2025 in China

Visa Requirements

All delegates traveling to China for GIANT PRAWN 2025 must obtain a proper visa before arrival. Please review the following information carefully:

Visa Type: Most delegates will require an M visa for business activities

Application Process:

- Complete the online visa application form at <https://cova.mfa.gov.cn> or <https://www.visaforchina.cn/globe/> – Print and sign the visa application form
- Submit your passport and required documents to the nearest Chinese visa application center
- Required Documents: Valid passport with at least 6 months remaining validity and two blank visa pages – Completed and signed visa application form – Recent passport sized photograph – Invitation letter issued by the conference organizers – Round-trip flight itinerary and Hotel reservation
- **Processing Time: – Standard service: 4 business days – Express service: 2–3 business days (additional fees apply)
- Application Deadline: Submit your visa application at least 2 months before the event to allow for processing time

Travel Logistics

- Flights: Book your flights to arrive in China on or before June 7, 2025, and depart on or after June 12, 2025. The airport is Shanghai Pudong International Airport.
- A convenient high-speed railway link connecting Shanghai and Huzhou in just about 55 minutes is operational since December 2024. Check the link: <https://www.rome2rio.com/s/Shanghai/Huzhou> for multiple transport options to Huzhou from Shanghai. Further information on airport transfers will be provided closer to the event date.
- Accommodation: A list of recommended hotels near the conference venue will be available on the event website.
- Local Transportation: Details on transportation options between the hotel and conference venue will be provided in your delegate information pack.
- Important Notes – Ensure your passport is valid for at least 6 months beyond your planned stay in China. Check with your local Chinese embassy or consulate for the most up-to-date visa requirements, as they may vary by country. Consider purchasing travel insurance to cover any unforeseen circumstances– Be prepared to provide additional documentation if requested by Chinese authorities.

Submission of Abstracts & Presentations

1. GIANT PRAWN 2025 encourages the submission of high-quality oral and poster presentations.
2. Poster presentations will be an integral part of the program. Abstracts submitted for "oral presentation only" may not be accepted as oral presentations due to the limited number of available time slots. All abstracts must be in English – the official language of the conference.
3. Each oral presenter shall be entitled to a total of 15 minutes to present their abstract. To ensure compatibility with the conference timetable and in fairness to other presenters session chairs will be instructed to insist on exact timing of your presentation.
4. Oral presentations must only use PowerPoint.
5. Overhead projectors, slides, and video players will not be available or allowed.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR PREPARATION OF ABSTRACTS

1. **TITLE OF ABSTRACT:** The abstract title should be printed in CAPITAL LETTERS, with the exception of scientific names which should be Upper/lower case and italicized. Scientific names should not be preceded or followed by commas or parentheses or other markings.
2. **AUTHOR(S):** The first name should be the presenting author. Use * after the presenting author. Type in upper/lower case.
3. **ADDRESS AND EMAIL:** Type only the presenting author's institution, address and email. Type in upper/lower case.
4. **MAXIMUM LENGTH:** One Page
5. **PAGE SIZE:** Standard 210mm x 297mm A4 paper (portrait)
6. **MARGINS:** 2.5 cm margin throughout (left/right/top/bottom)
7. **SPACING:** Single spaced
8. **PARAGRAPHS:** Paragraphs should be separated by a blank line and should not be indented.
9. **FORMATS:** Times New Roman 12 point type.
10. **FIGURES & TABLES:** Figures and tables are highly recommended. They should be reduced to the appropriate size for a one page abstract and should be clearly readable at the reduced size in black print only. The reduced figures and tables should be included in the abstract in camera-ready form. Figures in colour are not permissible.
11. **MEASUREMENTS:** Use metric units of measurement. When needed, English equivalents may be given in parentheses.

Deadline for submission of abstracts is **30 April 2025**.

GP2025 PRESENTATION GUIDELINES

Guidelines for Oral Presentations:

A maximum of **20 minutes** has been allocated for each oral presentation (unless you receive different instructions from your Session Chair). It is recommended that the talk is no longer than **15 minutes**, allowing **5 minutes** for questions and discussion.

Deadline for submission of presentation files is **20 May 2025**

Make sure your PowerPoint presentation is in 16:9 ratio.

The format of file name should be: "GP2025-XXX.ppt" or "GP2025-XXX.pptx" where XXX is your three-digit Registration Number eg., "GP2025-999.pptx". [After registering to Giant Prawn 2025, you will receive an email mentioning your registration number. Please check your email for details.]

Electronic Poster (e-Poster) submission and presentation guidelines:

GP2023 will offer the poster session as electronic posters on touch screens placed in designated locations at the conference venue. We kindly remind authors to show up at their assigned monitors during the scheduled time. Discussions regarding your e-Poster must take place during this designated time. Additionally, if an oral presentation is scheduled, please be ready for it.

Before the meeting, you will receive your e-Poster ID and computer assignment. However, we advise checking the schedule as soon as you arrive at the venue to ensure there haven't been any last-minute changes on the day of your presentation, poster schedule, or monitor designated for your presentation. We really appreciate your participation and anticipate an exciting and fruitful discussion at the session.

GP2025 PRESENTATION GUIDELINES

Essential Information on e-Posters:

- All electronic poster presentations must be in English to ensure effective communication
- The posters will be displayed on touchscreen kiosks at the designated displaying time, where the presenters can select which poster they want to display
- The e-poster is to be prepared in a landscape orientation for displaying on a 55" LCD screen, in the widescreen ratio of 16:9, preferably at a resolution of 1920x1080 Pixels (HDTV format, presentation)
- Please ensure that your upload file size is less than 50MB
- At the top of your poster, start by writing your paper's title, full name, institutional affiliation, and contact details
- Write a succinct and clear title for your e-poster that complements the abstract you have given
- Clearly label all authors with superscript Arabic numbers (e.g., 1, 2) and their respective institutional affiliations and addresses
- Use headings, bullets, numbering, and relevant graphic elements throughout your poster to maintain readability and clarity
- Remember to include acknowledgments and list your references at the end of your poster
- Utilize graphics, tables, and images effectively to enhance your presentation
- Use the Arial font on your poster and make sure it can be read at a distance of 1.5 meters. Bold should be used for titles and subheadings, while italics should be avoided
- Use hyperlinks in your poster to point people to any additional information if you desire
- Remember that backdrops with plenty of textures that are too bright or dark may distract readers
- Ensure the figures and photos are clear enough and have a minimum resolution of 300 dpi. Restrict the number of photographs to only necessary and pertinent ones—ideally, no more than 4–6
- Exclude from your poster any irrelevant images or graphics that are not relevant, including cartoon characters
- Present data in units commonly accepted in scientific publications, preferably using the international metric system
- Include a footer at the bottom of your poster with the statement: "Presented at: GP2025"
- Submit your E-Poster in PDF format only using the link given above
- Ensure that you meet the deadline for submitting your e-Poster, 20 May 2025. Failure to do so may result in the cancellation of your presentation. We appreciate your cooperation in adhering to this deadline to make the appropriate venue arrangements.
